# Proposed Black History Museum

The Zoning Board of Adjustment commenced its hearing on the variances being sought by Philadelphia '76, Inc., for its proposed museum at Sixth and Pine on Thursday, February 20, 1975. The hearing was not completed but has been continued until February 27, 1975, at 1:30 p.m. in Room 603, City Hall Annex, Juniper and Filbert Streets. Any interested person in the neighborhood should make an effort to attend this important hearing, and should arrive well before the scheduled hour to ensure getting a seat.

The SHCA adopted the resolutions printed elsewhere on this sheet at the membership meeting held on February 11, 1975. Comparable resolutions were adopted by the PAC. Your Board and the Association's representatives have sought to implement these resolutions, and negotiations have been held with Philadelphia, '76, Inc., and the other sponsors of the project. While some concessions have been made, the sponsors have to date failed to make any substantial cutback in the size of the proposed museum so as to satisfy the Urban Renewal Plan or the Zoning Code. The Association will oppose the granting of the variances before the Zoning Board.
